Let's talk about Funerals!

Funerals? Really? Yes, we're going to talk about funerals for a few minutes.

A 2023 survey showed that less than 47% of people would like a funeral service after they die (conducted by an organization called Theos: Love, Grief, and Hope). This is a sharp drop from previous years. Some reasons given were: the decreasing number of people with any religious affiliation, and the increasing costs related to a funeral – people don't want to leave financial burden and stress for their loved ones.

Besides these, there is a bigger reason for the decreasing number of funeral services - we prefer to keep death and anything associated with death out of sight and out of mind. While we are living, we don't want to think about our death, or funeral service, or casket vs cremation, or any of those things. However, from my experience in helping families plan funeral services for loved ones, it always goes so much better when deceased person has the left instructions and communicated them ahead of time. Funerals are valuable and helpful in bringing closure, comfort, and healing to those who are grieving.

Whenever a loved one passes away, family members enter into an intense time of stress, grief, and disorientation. There are a lot of details to care for and decisions to make - and most of them are unfamiliar and tension-filled.



It can be a real gift to family members, when a loved one leaves instructions to those who will be caring for these complex details (and better yet, has discussed them with their loved ones). It is good to plan ahead:

- Where would you like to be buried? Is this paid for already or not?
- Do you prefer to be cremated or buried in a casket? Is this paid for already or not?
- Do you have a preference with the funeral service company to use? Have you met with them yet or not?

When planning a funeral service...

- Where will it be held?
- Are there any special songs or Scripture passages you'd like included?
- Are there any family members or friends that you want to share memories or tributes? Have you asked them yet or not?
- Do you have a specific pastor or officiant in mind to lead the service and/ or share a message? Have you discussed this with them yet or not?

A Note from Pastor Kelly continued ...

If these items are in place and have been discussed with family members ahead of time, the easier things will be. It is helpful and good to think about your funeral service and to make these plans now, while you are able to, as a gift to your loved ones. You don't have to wait until you reach a certain age or are facing declining health, these plans can be made and discussed anytime. We don't know when others may be planning our funeral service, so caring for these details sooner than later is always wise.

If you are on the fence about having a funeral service, can I suggest a few reasons why I encourage people to hold a funeral or memorial service for their loved ones?

- As believers and followers of Jesus, we do not need to fear death. We shouldn't keep death at arm's distance, because we know that Christ has overcome and defeated death. Denying our mortality or avoiding thoughts of death isn't a helpful or faith-filled response to the Gospel work of Jesus in our lives 'even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me.' (Psalm 23:4). Christ has given us the ability to look at death, even our own, without fear.
- In many ways, your funeral is not for you it is for the people who care for you and love you. Where else can you bring all the different people in your life together in one place: family, co-workers, neighbors, church, friends, etc? For many of these people an opportunity to gather together, share memories, celebrate and honor your life, and to recognize your impact is a very meaningful and important part of the healing and grieving process. The absence of a funeral service can prolong and complicate grief, loss, mourning, and sadness for your loved ones.
- Funerals are one of the best opportunities to share the Good News of Christ and His salvation with the people you care for. When people attend a funeral service, they expect to hear words of comfort and hope and what greater comfort and hope can we offer than Jesus. As people reflect on their own death and eternal future, there is a powerful opportunity to respond to Christ and the Gospel.
- Funerals can provide a powerful reminder of the victory, celebration, and freedom Jesus has earned on the Cross. Not only through the words, message, and Scripture that is shared but simply the act of gathering together, enjoying good food, serving those who are grieving, singing songs of worship, sharing fellowship and stories, hugs and handshakes, tears and laughter... all of these stare death in the face and proclaim that Christ has won, death has been defeated, and your eternal home in heaven is assured through Him.
- In times of grief, we need to lean on others. Grief becomes so much more difficult when you are experiencing it in isolation. Funerals show us that there is a community of people who are experiencing this grief together even when we may have varying degrees of relationship with the deceased. One of the best ways to comfort those who are grieving is simply through your presence at a funeral service showing up, being there, physically present. There is a special ministry to family members and those grieving the loss of a loved one, just by attending and being present at a funeral service. When Jesus physically arrived at the tomb of Lazarus, we are told that He wept He wept with those who were weeping, He stood among the grieving, His presence brought comfort. In His strength, we can also do the same.
- Your life matters to God and to others. You might hear someone say they don't want to have a funeral, because they don't want to be a burden or don't want people to make a fuss about them. The truth is that you are a blessing to many and you are precious to God. You were made in His image and His divine love has been offered to you before you were even born. There is a reason why Scripture is filled with lists of names of people that we don't remember or know much about they all mattered to God. He knew them. It is a blessing to plan, attend, and participate in a funeral service, not a burden. Every life is precious to God including yours. A funeral doesn't have to be extravagant or expensive to be meaningful.
- Your funeral service is a significant book-end to a life that should be honored, celebrated, and remembered and an opportunity to give thanks and glory to the God who created you, cared for you, guided you, blessed you, provided for you, and saved you through Christ.

There are many helpful resources in planning a funeral service. There are several funeral home services in our local area who do very good work, meeting with individuals, couples, or families to pre-plan a lot of these details (you don't have to do everything they suggest). There are guides and checklists online that you can use. You can meet with me or any other pastor who you would like to be involved as well.




